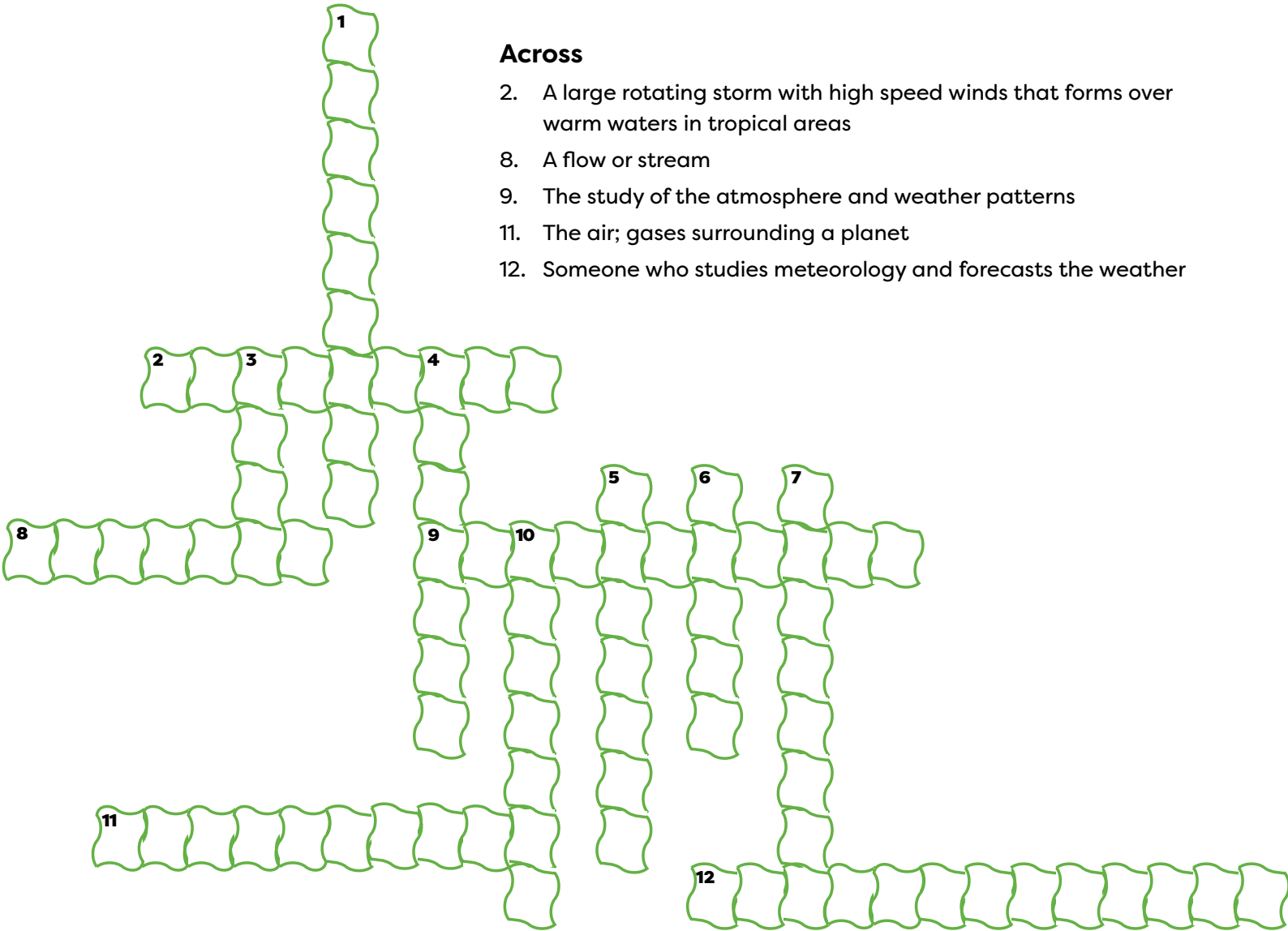


Wild and Wacky Weather Words!

12. Someone who studies meteorology and forecasts the weather

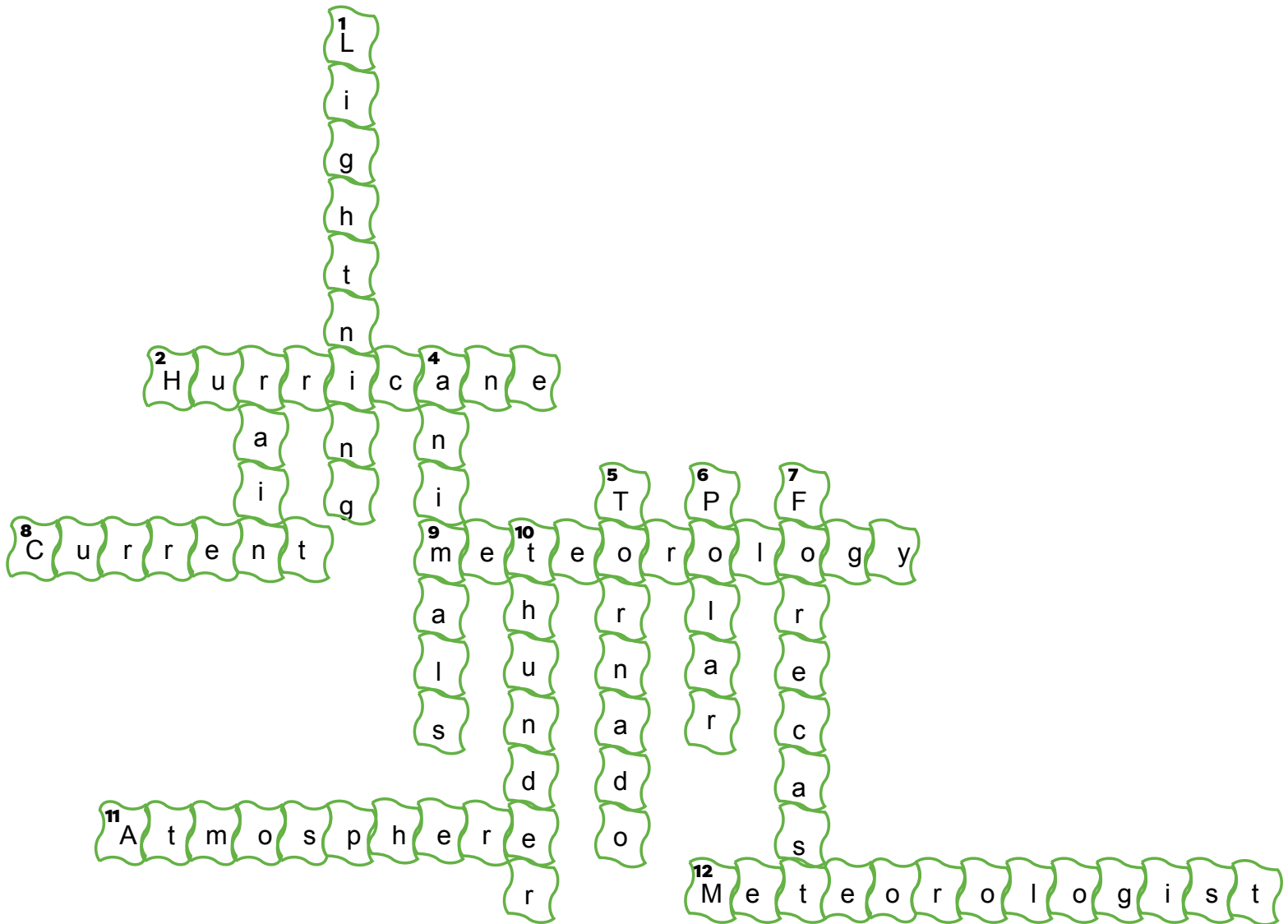
Down

6. Regions which get little or no sunlight and get colder temperatures
7. A prediction of future events; for instance, the weather



- 1: Down, top square.
- 2: Across, second square from left.
- 3: Across, third square from left.
- 4: Across, fourth square from left.
- 5: Down, fifth square from top.
- 6: Down, sixth square from top.
- 7: Down, seventh square from top.
- 8: Across, eighth square from left.
- 9: Across, ninth square from left.
- 10: Across, tenth square from left.
- 11: Across, eleventh square from left.
- 12: Across, twelfth square from left.
